European Travellers Club (ETC) Project

Roll-out ACCEPT EcoSpace (transaction router) for cross border and MaaS

- November 2011: founded **e-TSAP** (knowledge sharing network for e-ticketing schemes), see www.e-tsap.net

- January 2010 founded as **Open Ticketing Institute** (see www.openticketing.eu) an independent not for profit entity;
- subsidy from Ministry of Transport (The Netherlands) and contribution of public transport company in the Netherlands;
- 2 goals: (1) implementation new security architecture Dutch OV-chipkaart; (2) set-up knowledge sharing network;
- own employees, seconded by Translink and external support.

- May 2012: finalisation and delivery migration program to Translink (The Netherlands);
- August 2012: only own employees and external support, no secondment.

- December 2014: opening **Demonstration and Test Lab**;
- Development of the **account-based travelling (ABT)** concept, request for EU-subsidy;
- founded **Advisory Council** (NTA, TLS, Rejsekort, Verkeiersverbond, Transp. Scotland en ITSO).

- May 2015: kick-off **ETC project** (EU grant: Horizon 22020). Seamless cross-border public transport, usage of the ABT concept;
- 2 pilots: (1) cross-border Maastricht–Aachen; (2) park&ride pilot in Luxemburg;
- development **ACCEPT EcoSpace**: transaction router, APIs and distribution of IDs.

- Nov. 2017: change name Open Ticketing to **ACCEPT Institute**;
- May 2018: finalisation EU Grant.

- December 2018: **Letter of Intent** regarding roll-out ETC-concept;
- Transaction router for **MaaS program** (Ministry of Transport, The Netherlands).

- further roll-out;
- support MaaS Pilots, Learning-environment + distribution MaaS IDs.
